As shown by NPS records there were many men in the Civil War with the "Allen" surname whose first initial was "A" (for Adam, Alonzo, Andrew, Arnold, etc. etc.) so we can't assume "A. Allen" stands for "Arnold Allen." The National Cemetery couldn't make that determination and, to the contrary, their records show that their "A. Allen" died on April 9, 1865, not March 26, 1865 when "Arnold Allen" died. I've attached his bio with a slight change from the one I sent most recently that indicated he died 03/29/65 (the date of his comrade's letter) not 03/26/65 (the date of Arnold's death).
